<sup>\*</sup> Latex Paint: \$1.00/gallon or under container; \$5.00/5 gallon container

<sup>\*</sup> Latex paint is accepted, however, it is not hazardous and can be disposed with regular trash, if solidified. Cat litter, sand, saw dust or soil can be used to solidify latex paint. A box lined with a trash bag or partially filled paint cans can hold the solidified material. If paint cans are used, leave lid off so waste hauler can see the paint is dry.
