Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am by Chief Kowalski.

Minute Approval

The minutes from the January 9, 2017 meeting were available for review. Ryan Sedlock made a motion to accept the minutes. The minutes were accepted.

Training

Brent reported the CE comments and graphs from February were available. February's topic was Pediatric Emergencies and the Handtevy. March will introduce the Sepsis protocol and address the issues on the ResQGARD. Dr. Schwerin asked if there will be meds used taking care of sepsis patients. Brent replied no meds. Brent said they were looking at LR as a fluid choice, but staying with Normal Saline.

Craig Koperski mentioned IV fluids are on back order and we are okay on saline for right now.

Old Business

Sirens – Ryan Sedlock asked if it is resolved hands free function for sirens in the life squad. Dennis replied it was an overlooked issue with the vendor and the issue is being corrected by Burgess.

Ryan also asked if the county was going forward with head-sets in the life squad. Dennis replied we did the test in the vehicle and we are within standards.

New Business

JEMS Games – Dennis reported congratulations to the two paramedic teams in the JEMS games. They took first and second place in the first round. Brent reported there were 19 other teams with a couple international teams. Brent said it was the same match up as last year. Wake Forest took first place and we took second and 3rd place. Brent commented that he would like to see others involved in the competition and to continue competing.

Discussion

ePCR – Dennis reported Lucas County is moving forward with ESO ePCR and other jurisdictions are looking at it as well. There will be a demo set up. The other jurisdictions want to do it off our contract. The question of time frame was asked. Dennis reported our legal department just looked at the contract and are making adjustments. It will be relative quick afterwards.

A discussion relative to merging reports from the other entities and how would that work. Ryan asked if there will be training. Brent replied yes.

Vending Machines – Craig reported the vending machines at the Annex are going well. The next two sets are on order and will go to St. Charles and Toledo and will be set up as the Annex. One black locker & two vending machines. Craig reported we gave the dimensions to St. Charles and they will have the space.

Narcotics & par levels – Craig brought up the issues of par levels of Morphine and Fentanyl and wastage when they expire. Currently the life squads have 10 of each and asked about reducing to 4 to 6. Have two in the med box and 3 in the safe for a total of five on the rig.

Dennis reported this issue came up at the Fire Chief's meeting relative to making sure drugs are locked up on the life squads. The State are doing inspections and making sure they are secured and we want to make sure we are meeting the requirements and everything is tagged.

Dr. Lindstrom reported the reason we went with the par levels of ten (10) was to have enough for long weekends, holidays, multiple patients. Dr. Lindstrom reported we will continue the wastage and its an arbitrary position.

Lt. Reed asked for numbers and Craig will get the numbers and this topic will be tabled until the next meeting.

Life Squad Storage – Ryan commented the life squads are having to have more and more things, such as RTF mass casualty equipment and did the county consider looking at the cab configuration at the next vehicle committee. Other EMS systems have a roll out doors to hold extra supplies.

Craig brought up the issue of duplication of equipment going into a scene.

Mark Briggs brought up the issue of an extended rig and could be challenging on some of the streets and fitting in the fire station.

Retirement – Chief Kowalski reported today was his last meeting. He said he started in 1979 and back then it was a Mother May I to our current system and citing how far it has come. Jeff said he has appreciated everything that has been done to get us where we are today.

Adjournment

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:45 a.m. The next meeting is May 8th.

February 27, 2017


- Please bring back “Case of the Month”. Review of our CPR numbers/stats

February 28, 2017
















